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
Welcome to the Department of Economics, Calcutta University.

## **Examination and Grading**

- For all Theory papers the final grade will be 20% internal assessment and 80% end-semester examination.
- For each Practical paper and the Group Project the final grade will be 40% internal assessment and 60% end-semester evaluation.
- All comprehensive papers will be of MCQ (Multiple-Choice-Question)-Type and for them there will be no internal assessment component in the final grade.

## Requirements for degree

- It shall be compulsory for candidates to pass each paper of the program to qualify for the degree.
- To pass a paper a candidate shall have to get at least 40% marks.
- If a paper of 50 marks contains both theory (25 marks) and practical (25 marks) then a candidate has to secure at least 40% marks in both the parts separately.

#### Time limit

 A candidate must pass the entire M.A./M.Sc. examination consisting of four semesters within a maximum of four consecutive years with reference to the date of first admission

## Supplementary Examination

- If unsuccessful in maximum of two papers in a semester, eligible to appear in the supplementary examination but can continue in the next semester.
- If unsuccessful in more than two papers, cannot proceed to the higher semester without clearing the required number of papers.
- Maximum three chances in each paper including the original one.

#### Re-examination

 The students can avail re-examination facility for the theoretical papers (i.e. except practical papers and group project), provided he/she fulfills other conditions laid down by the Controller of Examination of the University.


